HAITI CONNECTION FOCUS OF 2018 SISTERS CELEBRATION

The connection between the founding of the Congregation of the Sisters, Servants of the Immaculate Heart of Mary, the island of Haiti, and the humanitarian work of two physicians, was the focus of the 2018 IHM Sisters Celebration. On Saturday, August 4, over 250 guests attended the event which serves as a major fundraiser for the IHM Foundation.

The Foundation honored the compassionate and lifesaving work in Haiti of Doctors Peter A. Cognetti, and John H. Doherty, Jr. Doctors Cognetti and Doherty were honored with the Sisters of IHM Spirit Award during the annual event.

"This year's event raised over \$47,000 in support of the retirement needs of the IHM sisters living at Pascucci Family Our Lady of Peace Residence in Scranton," stated John Murray, IHM Foundation president. Previous years' funds were used to purchase recliners, mattresses, a TV monitor for the dining and conference area, new appliances, and new flooring. In the last five years, the IHM Foundation has raised over \$300,000 for the IHM Sisters.

THERESA'S TREASURE PROVIDES FUNDING TO ASSIST THE HOUSE OF MARY

At the request of Sister Ancilla Maloney, IHM, Theresa's Treasure provided a \$1,000 grant to the Daughters of Mary Immaculate and Co-Redeemer. The funding will assist in the completion of a dormitory for the House of Mary, a residence for abused girls or girls who are in danger of being abused. The residence is located in Pampamarca, Peru, which is 12,500 feet above sea level and extremely cold. The dormitory was severely damaged during a storm over two years ago. The grant will bring the sisters one step closer to their goal.



TEMPORARY PROFESSION OF VOWS: A SIGN OF HOPE FOR TODAY'S WORLD

In the presence of family, IHM sisters and friends, Sister Elizabeth Ann DeMerchant professed temporary vows of poverty, chastity, and obedience and committed her life to God and to the IHM congregation.

Sister Elizabeth believes that religious, by their public profession of vows, are a sign of hope for people today. She herself is a hopeful person and has freely chosen a life of vowed commitment with IHM sisters because she wants to do "something lasting and bigger" than she could accomplish by herself. In her own words, Sister Elizabeth asserts, "At the end of my days, if I have had less and a child has had an education or a chance for justice, and the earth is cleaner, then it will have been worth it."

SISTERS-TO-SISTERS, SCRANTON-TO-SYRIA

As the Baker's Dozen IHM Mission Group considered the plight of those victimized by the civil war in Syria, direct assistance did not appear to be an option. Collaborating with missionary sisters of other congregations, not a new concept for IHMs, did seem like a viable option.



Sisters of the Good Shepherd are missionaries assisting war refugees in Syria who have identified housing as a pressing need. Because the average rent costs 20 times their average salary, refugee families live together and children are sent to work rather than school. Baker's Dozen chose to assist refugee families with their rent and invited additional IHMs and friends to participate. So far, four months' rent has been contributed. In that spirit, Sister Angela Mary Parker, IHM, donated to the Sisters-to-Sisters project in memory of her parents who were born in Syria.

The philanthropic efforts of Pia Ferrario to assist Syrian refugees align with the desire of IHM sisters to support refugee families.

Pia, the 2017 Sisters of IHM Spirit Award recipient, has traveled with Catholic Relief Services. "These trips renew me as a human being and deepen my commitment as a Catholic. They provide an opportunity to see how our solidarity with the poorest and most vulnerable people is helping refugees overcome adversity," Pia reflected. "These experiences have left a deep imprint and inspired me to advocate for those in need."

Legacy of Friendship


