The Sisters of IHM are pleased to announce that a new IHM formation house and community has been established. We are grateful for a wonderful partnership with Marywood University and generous donations from grantors and benefactors including Helen Bozek, who left a bequest in her will, and two special friends of the IHM sisters who wish to remain anonymous. The location of the Annunciation Community - McCarty Hall on the campus of Marywood University and its proximity to the IHM Center, Our Lady of Peace Residence, and St. Joseph's Center offers women in initial formation the opportunity to root themselves in IHM history, charism, spirituality, and mission.

IHM CO-SPONSORED MINISTRY – ASEC

Catholic sisters dedicate their lives to service, working tirelessly to improve the conditions of their congregations and communities. Many African sisters lack the opportunity to learn new skills. They lack the education and resources to carry out their important work.

ASEC – African Sisters Education Collaborative – is a co-sponsored ministry of the IHM sisters. ASEC serves ten of the poorest countries in Sub-Saharan Africa. ASEC's goal is to increase African sisters' access to education and professional training enabling them to enhance and expand educational, healthcare, social, and spiritual services for the people they serve.

Sr. Prema Antony, PBVM serves at Presentation Secondary School where using the skills she learned in ASEC's Sisters Leadership Development Initiative (SLDI) program, she secured a grant for \$15,000 which paid for science lab equipment for the school.



SISTER ELEACE CONTINUES TO RESPOND TO THE NEEDS OF OTHERS



Through our ministries, the IHM sisters are committed to responding to the needs of others. For example, Sister Eleace King, IHM, recently began a new ministry as the coordinator of the English as a Second Language (ESL) Program in Scranton, PA.

Sister Eleace is also celebrating

her 50th jubilee as an IHM sister this year.

The ESL Program is sponsored by the Sisters of IHM in collaboration with St. John Neumann Parish. The adult students are from several different countries and speak different languages. The program is staffed entirely by volunteers, thirteen of

whom are IHM sisters. Non-native speakers are provided with the skills they need to become fluent in reading,

writing, and speaking English. The program mainly serves those who live on a limited income and desire to learn English to enhance the quality of their lives and to participate in the education of their school-aged children. This is an example of the way our sisters are dedicated to easing the burdens of those with special needs.

Sister Eleace, pictured left, earned a BA from Marywood University, an MS from Yeshiva University, and an EdD from Johns Hopkins University. She has spent

nearly 35 years in the ministry of education. Sister Eleace recognizes the importance of communicating effectively with health care providers, social service agencies, and potential employers and is committed to helping her students reach their full potential and strengthening their family lives.

buzzed in, thereby assuring the safety and well-being of the 68 retired and semi-retired IHM sisters who reside in this building as well as our many visitors throughout the year.

The long-term consequences of falls among older adults

are extensive and life-changing. That is why it is important to do everything possible to avoid falls in the first place. Thanks to the generosity of anonymous donors, the installation of handrails is complete on the second and third floors of the IHM Center, creating a safer environment and reducing the risk of devastating falls. 
DONOR-ADVISED FUNDS PROVIDE FLEXIBILITY

IHMS SERVE ALL PEOPLES IN ALL SEASONS AND ALL PLACES



Since 1845, IHMs have always responded to the urgent needs of the times. Today, we meet the critical needs of people throughout the United States, Latin America, and South America through our ministries of education, health care, social services to the marginalized, and pastoral/spiritual ministries.

Leadership teams in the IHM Congregation, from 1845 to the present, have prayerfully discerned the "signs of the times," in fulfilling the mission begun by our founders Rev. Louis Florent Gillet, CssR and Mother Theresa Maxis Duchemin. What does this statement mean?

The original mission to the poor and vulnerable populations continues, along with many former commitments, in a variety of new ministries. These include care of the sick and elderly, children and adults with intellectual and physical disabilities, literacy and English as a Second Language programs, food and clothing banks, and publishing to name a few.

IHM candidate Liz McGill and novice Giovana Fuentes Bendivez spent the month of January this year in Sicuani, Peru. The experience was an opportunity to immerse themselves in the Andean culture and integrate into the day-to-day spiritual, ministerial, and social activities of IHM Sisters Eileen Egan, Ancilla Maloney, and Norma Poma Arpi. Liz and Giovana helped the sisters with an educational and recreational summer program offered to over 100 children. They also traveled to Lima where Sister Dora Vizcarra introduced them to Peruvian culture, history, and art on the coast.



LOOKING FOR A DEEPER EXPERIENCE WITH GOD?

Consider Becoming An IHM Associate

IHM associates are women and men from all states of life and various creeds who are seeking a deeper experience of God for their own transformation and for the transformation of the world. This distinct relationship with the Sisters of IHM creates a mutual bond between the associates and the sisters that widens the circle of Jesus' unconditional love for all.

Meet the IHM associates from Peru:

Delfina is a parish catechist, high school religion teacher, and one of two representatives on the diocesan level.

Matilde is a parish adult catechist and a parish representative to the diocese. Matilde is bi-lingual and speaks Quechua, the language of the Incas, and Spanish. She uses both languages to clarify religious concepts for the adults in the parish.

Casilda works part-time as parish secretary and is a youth catechist in the parish. People in the outlying communities ask her to pray with them on various occasions.

Maura helps with the celebration of liturgy every Sunday in Pampa Anza, one of six Andean communities served by the sisters who minister in Sicuani. Maura joins Sister Eileen every week when they pray with the police of Sicuani in their compound. Maura celebrates funerals in the parish in Sister Eileen's place when she is away.

The new home was a huge undertaking which involved the transformation of McCarty Hall from a university dormitory to a home for seven IHM sisters. The project included hidden challenges within the walls, floors, and ceilings which required updating heat, water, and electrical systems. While the renovations were underway, the sisters collected and sorted through furniture, appliances, linens, dishes, and more which arrived from closing convents and apartments, Friends of the Poor, and personal donations.

In addition to serving as a formation house, Sister Mindy Welding, IHM, director of vocations, explained that McCarty Hall will also be a gathering place for college and high school students who would like to learn more about women religious.

We ask for your prayers for Giovana, Liz, and the sisters who accompany them. Through their formation experience, may they deepen their call and commitment to religious life, the IHM congregation, and the people they serve.

WHY WE GIVE TO THE IHMS – THE DONORS' STORY

The following is a reflection from Missy Wayne, a longtime supporter of the Sisters of IHM.

My connection with the Sisters of IHM has its roots in Susquehanna (Depot), PA in Susquehanna County where I was raised. This is the same place where Mother Theresa Maxis Duchemin, IHM, (foundress of IHM Congregation) was invited by Msgr. Vincent O'Reilly to educate the children of a growing population of immigrant farmers and railroad workers.

I received years of education from the IHM sisters including at St. John's Elementary School and one year of high school at Laurel Hill Academy. I received a bachelor's degree from Marywood University.

I remained in the congregation until 1984.

Over the past 34 years, I have returned to Scranton for IHM and Marywood events. I married Michael Wayne in Elmira, NY in 1991. He has a history of Catholic education involving the Sisters of Mercy (Rochester, NY) and the Vincentian Fathers (Niagara University).

Together, Mike and I support the ministries of the IHM sisters, both prayerfully and financially. We want to express our gratitude to all the sisters who provide education, health care, administrative assistance, and aid to the people of God in many places and in many ways.
