# SISTERS CELEBRATION GOES VIRTUAL!



The IHM Sisters have always sought to serve the needs of God's people since the congregation's founding during 1845. This year, the congregation is celebrating its 175th anniversary, and needs your help more than ever. The congregation is doing everything

necessary to ensure the safety of all its sisters, especially those who are most vulnerable, but revenue has declined and expenses have continued to rise during the coronavirus pandemic.

# SISTERS AND ASSOCIATES ADAPT MINISTRIES DURING THE PANDEMIC

The shelter-in-place directive from our state governors has changed the way the IHM sisters and associates carry out their various ministries. All continue to pray for the health and safety of you and your loved ones during these challenging times. Right now, IHM Sister Francis Rose Lapitino's one-on-one personal visits with the sisters residing at Our Lady of Peace Residence are on hold. Always one to keep in touch with others, Sister Frannie is sending personal written notes and making phone calls to the sisters and anyone she knows who lives alone. Sister also sends humorous texts

and photos to the health care staff at OLP in appreciation for their dedication during these trying times.



Every morning, IHM Sister Jeanne Marie McAuliffe's cheerful smile greeted visitors as they entered OLP Residence. Then in March, the facility closed its doors to visitors but Sister still remains as a receptionist. These days Sister Jeanne is busy assembling the new IHM Remembrance Cards to keep up with the many requests for these

beautiful cards. (See page 5 for information about the new cards) Sister is also organizing the materials for the Silver Circle sellers' packets.



"While our vocation venues such as schools, parishes, and events have been closed, communication remains all around us," said Sister Mindy Welding, IHM, director of vocations. Sr. Mindy is working with the Diocesan Vocation Office to present the Bold Choices Retreat for young adults through recorded and live sessions via ZOOM

and is preparing a recorded XLT. (Exalt - an evening of praise and worship, prayer, reflection and exposition/benediction) "While places may be 'closed' God's voice is never shut off and so we continue to pray, plan, reach out, and hope in the future!" added Sister Mindy.

"One-on-one personal visits with our sisters at OLP and the elderly and ill in parishes by IHM Associates are temporarily halted. Phone conversations, email messages, text conversations, and written notes have become the norm for IHM associates," reports Ms. Jane O'Neill, director of IHM associates.



Some associates have responded to the needs of the poor and those who are out of work by volunteering at and contributing to food pantries, collections, and giveaways. "Associates like Ann Williams, Friends of the Poor, Stewardship Manager, whose occupation is their ministry and are considered essential workers, continue to go to their

ministry sites and in many cases are working longer hours than before the pandemic," added Jane.

IHM Sisters Donna Korba and Kate Clancy practice social distancing while planting trees on the grounds of the IHM Center. "Amidst the coronavirus outbreak, tending to the earth is healing for the human soul," said Sister Donna. "IHM sisters have a strong commitment to care for our planet, Earth." The sisters are planting a portion of the native tree species in honor of the IHM 175th Anniversary celebration.





"These past several weeks of sheltering at home have been both challenging and deeply meaningful for the women in initial formation.
Like everyone else, Sisters Giovana
Fuentes Bendívez and

Elizabeth McGill have had to respond creatively to the new normal," said Sister Mary Elaine Anderson, IHM, director of formation.

Sister Giovana has been taking theology and psychology courses online offered by universities at no cost. When Giovana was no longer able to continue classes with her sister-teachers at the IHM Center and OLP, Sister Michael Marie Hartman, IHM, who lives with Giovana, volunteered to tutor her daily!

Sister Elizabeth has been studying Feminist Theology online with Sister Nancy Hawkins and helping with the Food Give Away Days organized by Friends of the Poor. In coordination with Sister Mary Kay Faliskie, IHM, Sister Elizabeth planned a gathering of the sisters in Scranton to show their appreciation for the selfless service of the staff at Our Lady of Peace.

Born in Baltimore to unwed parents of mixed racial lineage, Theresa Maxis Duchemin knew the harsh effects of prejudice and learned that doors otherwise closed could be opened through education. She was one of the four original members of the Oblate Sisters of Providence, and was the first U.S.-born African-American to become a religious sister and superior general of her congregation. Later, at the invitation of Father Louis Florent Gillet, a Redemptorist priest, Theresa left all behind and traveled to Monroe, Michigan. There, in 1845, she and Father Gillet founded the

Congregation of the Sisters, Servants of the Immaculate Heart of Mary. The journey of faith undertaken by Theresa and Father Gillet was born in a shared dream of opportunity and possibility for those most in need. Ever faithful to the inner

call of God's Spirit, their courage, trust, passion, persistence, vision, and love for the most vulnerable became the lasting legacy for all IHMs who have followed in their footsteps.

MaryCarol and Peter Kanton will be honored with the 2020 Spirit of IHM Award in recognition of their commitment to and embodiment of the IHM spirit. The couple shares a great love for the IHMs, the local community, and a desire to give back focusing on Scranton

area nonprofits and IHM-sponsored ministries. Several of the causes where the Kantons volunteer include St. Joseph's Center and Auxiliary, ARC of NEPA, the Erin Jessica Moreken Drug & Alcohol Treatment Fund, and the Marywood Alumni Association.

MaryCarol first met the IHM sisters as a child when her family relocated to Scranton, PA. She credits the sisters with having a profound influence on her decision to become a teacher. After receiving bachelor's and master's degrees from Marywood College (now University), MaryCarol taught elementary school for 39 years.

"I learned one of my most valuable life lessons – the importance of helping those in need – from the IHMs," says Mrs. Kanton.

The Kantons reside in Moosic where Peter owns Kanton Realty, a real estate brokerage and appraisal firm. They have two daughters, Ann Weller and Colleen Devine, sons-in-law, Gerald Weller and Tom Devine, and four grandchildren, one of whom is a current student at Marywood University.
