Read - Pray - Reflect on these Scripture passages.

The following Scripture passages explore Jesus' use of imagination to heal, to comfort, to teach. Jesus invites us to join Him in our own imagination to be present, to hear, to share.

Mary Prays Her Magnificat-Luke 1:51-53

"Mary said, 'He has shown might with His arm, dispersed the arrogant of mind and heart...thrown down rulers from their thrones and lifted the lowly. The hungry He has filled with good things, the rich He has sent away empty."

Mary imagines a world where ALL believe and live the words and actions of Jesus. What are some obstacles to allowing Mary's imagination to take root in your family, your workplace, your neighborhood? Who most needs your gifts and imagination to be shared?

Jesus Heals the Man Born Blind – John 9:1,6-7

"Jesus saw a man born blind from birth...He spat on the ground and made clay with the saliva and smeared the clay on his eyes. He said, "Go wash in the Pool of Siloam." So he went and washed and came back able to see."

Jesus used what was at hand - the dirt of the earth, spittle and water to bring sight to the blind man.

Often our imagination can lead us to use the ordinary to accomplish the extraordinary. Name a time when a simple solution solved a big problem. Give examples of people who are never stumped by the impossible.

The Strength of St. Paul – Philippians 4:13

"I have the strength for everything through him who empowers me."

We may feel at times that our imaginative energy has dried up. We may not be able to think in new ways. St. Paul tells us that God's help is always near at hand.

Describe some times when the fruit of your prayer was overwhelming as you found God by your side. What are ways to pray with greater confidence in the creative imagination that God has given as gift?

King David Gives the Throne to Solomon – 1Chronicles 28:9

"As for you, Solomon, my son, know the God of your father and serve him with a perfect heart and willing soul, for the Lord searches all hearts and understands all the mind's thoughts. If you seek him, he will let himself be found by you."

God will never leave us alone in our imaginings. He accompanies us in our desire to use our gifts to the fullest.

Who are people in your midst who provide encouragement and assist you in imagining something new? How does their encouragement remind you of the Presence of God?

Attuning to the Spirit:

In what ways do these Scripture passages speak to your heart and spirit about the use of imagination in companioning others?

Our Direction Statement encourages a focus on the power of our imagination. Sister Theresa Maxis and Father Louis Gillet imagined a religious congregation devoted to Mary and centered on the redeeming love of Jesus.

How can we as followers of Theresa Maxis and Louis Gillet not imagine as well? How can we listen to the nightly news, hear conversations in our local circles, see the obvious needs around us, and not imagine what could be?

Reflect and Share:

- What is possible in your own realm of Associate relationship to address obvious needs?
- Imagine the future of IHM Associate relationship in keeping the dream of Theresa and Louis alive. Share your imaginings.
